Temple Emanuel Welcomes Rabbi Arthur Green

Temple Emanuel will welcome Rabbi Arthur Green as the Charlotte Behrendt Memorial Scholar-in-Residence on Jan. 14 and 15. This event will be open to the community.

Dr. Green, a prolific author, has published three books, Ehyeh: A Kabbalah For Tomorrow, A Guide To The Zohar, and his new groundbreaking book, Radical Judaism.

Rector of the new transdenominational seminary, Hebrew College, Rabbi Green serves as the Irving Brudnick professor of philosophy and religion and is also professor Emeritus at Brandeis University. Previous to his current positions, Green taught at the University of Pennsylvania and the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College, serving as dean and president from 1984 to 1993.

On Jan. 14, services will begin at 7:30 p.m., and Rabbi Green will discuss “Torah from the Heart—New Readings of an Old Tradition” in the Bess P. Maltz Center. There will be a Shabbat dinner at 6:15 p.m. preceding services. On Jan. 15 at the New Emanuel Minyan service, Green will give a presentation entitled “Where Do We Come From? Where Are We Going?—A Jewish Look at Evolution.”

This will begin at 9:30 a.m. in the Bess P. Maltz Center, and Rabbi Green will speak at 11 a.m. Admission to both services is complimentary and copies of Rabbi Green’s Radical Judaism will be available for purchase.

“We are honored to have Rabbi Green join us,” commented Rabbi Laura Geller, Temple Emanuel. “He is recognized as one of the world’s preeminent authorities on Jewish thought and spirituality and we look forward to his presentation.”
